Boys and Girls Leagues are available in the following age groups: U5-2014, U6-2013 Boys, U5-2014, U6-2013 Girls, U8-2011/2012 Boys, U8-2011/2012 Girls, U10-2009/2010 Boys, U10-2009/2010 Girls, U12-2007/2008 Boys, U12-2007/2008 Girls, U14-2005/2006 Boys, U14-2005/2006 Girls, High School Boys-2001-2004 and High School Girls-2001-2004. This is a recreation soccer program it is not a club/travel program.

AGE DETERMINATION DATE: A child's birth year determines the age group in which the child will play. A child must turn four (4) during 2014 Calendar Year to play in the Clinic. Proof of age may be required. Children who are born between 9/1/2004 and 12/31/2004 may register with the U14-2005/06 age group or the HS-2001-2004 age group but not both age groups.

Game Locations: U5 and U6 boys clinics and U5 and U6 girls clinics will run at Chapel Hill Elementary gym and Joppa View Elementary on Saturdays beginning in early January, 2019. U8, U10, U12, U14, and HS age groups will play at North East Regional Recreation Center, NERRC, in the Baltimore County Recreation League. League play at NERRC is expected to begin early January.
